

From Incheon International Airport

Take KAL limousine bus (6707B) bound for Songdo and get off at the Sheraton Incheon Hotel. Take a taxi and arrive at the SUNY Korea Campus.

From Seoul

By subway

Get off at the "Techno Park" station on the Incheon Line and use Exit 2. Then take the 6-2 bus and get off at the "Songdo Global Campus (SUNY Korea)" stop.

By bus

- 1. Take the blue Inter-city bus M6405 from one of the following stations:
 - Gangnam Station (Exit 7)
 - Seocho Station (Exit 1)
 - Gyodae (Seoul National University of Education) Station (Exit 1)
 - Yanjae Station (Exit 10)

Take the bus from one of the stations listed above and get off at "Songdo Sungji Apartment" stop and cross the road to "Hanjin Apartment" stop. Then take the 91 bus. Get off at "Yeonsei University" stop and walk 5 minutes to SUNY Korea.

- 2. Take the Inter-city bus M6724 from one of the following stations:
 - Hapjeong Station (Exit 10)
 - Hongdae Ipgu (Hongik University) Station (Exit 2)

lake the bus from one of the stations listed above and get off at "Yeonsej University" stop and walk 5 minutes to SUNY Korea
